Project title

Home based support and skills development for OVCs living in child headed and elderly headed homesteads and community care

About the project

Many Children in Swaziland have lost their parents due to AIDS. Older siblings or the very old and frail are now in charge to look after babies and young children. This project supports carers as well as young children by ensuring that all affected homesteads get basic physical and psycho-social support.

The program aims to strengthen the 32 currently integrated children with a holistic program, giving children skills, guidelines, information and care to strengthen their ability to develop into healthy, happy and productive adults. Moya centre strives to strengthen manifold burdened youths and children and give them support within their homestead as well as in school. As long as they have Moya to take their side, children are able to defend their rights in their natural context and are able to grow up in their home.

The longterm aim of the committed staff and director at Moya is to develop strong and self-sufficient individuals who are able to strengthen their communities and who have developed a high social responsibility.
